

## **Perennials for Dry Locations**

The following is a list of plants that are tolerant of drier than usual soil conditions. This, however, does not mean that they do not need occasional water, especially for the first two weeks after planting, or during periods of long drought. Some of these plants are also better suited for extremely dry conditions than others; these are marked with an \*.
